Project Evaluation Form – Children.

1. What did you like doing in the project?

The children enjoyed the activities they did with their parents, or the activities that they did and the results of which they shared with their parents. These included: drawing, painting, writing little books, making greetings cards, colouring the flags of the partner countries, dressing up in the colours of the partner countries. They also enjoyed playing with the games they received from the partners, especially in their English lessons.

2. What did you learn about the other countries and people in the project?

In addition to the names of the partners’ countries, the children learnt where the countries are, the names of the capital cities, the currency people use in those countries, they know the flag /colours of the country, they know stories about the countries (e.g. what the flag represents), the “leads” the country (president / queen), whether the countries are by the sea or not, etc.

3. What did you learn about your mother/father/parent?

The children who participated in the summer activities remembered that they were surprised that their mother / father enjoyed drawing. One little girl learnt that her mom was the best in her class at maths; most of the children learnt that their parents’ handwriting is not very easy to read.

4. What is it like to do work/activities with your mother/father/parent?

They all enjoyed all the activities in the project, and think it is fun to work/do things with their parents.
